This aspect of sharing and viewing products from different cultural backgrounds aimed to foster cross-cultural exchange and inspire learning from one another.

It further emphasized the importance of lifelong learning and encouraged students to actively participate in a community.

3rd Round of National Stakeholder Meetings

The project partners conducted in June and July the 3rd National Stakeholder national meeting. The aim of these meetings is to further enhance the impact of the KIDS4ALL project activities and results in the different national contexts.

The National Stakeholder Groups were composed of representatives of teachers, headmasters and social workers' organizations, parents' organizations, and children and youth organizations at regional and national levels.
